SURGING KNIGHTS FACE DEFENDING CHAMPS in QUARTERFINAL ROUND

After a one-year absence, the *Clarkson University Hockey* teams returns to the quarterfinal round of the *Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC)* playoffs for the 41st time in the 43-year history of the league's postseason tournament. The *Golden Knights*, guided by first-year head coach *George Roll*, associate coach *Greg Drechsel* and assistant coach *Jean-Francois Houle*, are coming off their most impressive efforts of the season after sweeping Union College in the first round series in Schenectady. For the first time this season, the *Green and Gold* won two games on the same weekend against an ECAC foe by defeating the Dutchmen twice at Achilles Center.

After playing 14 consecutive games that were decided by one or two goals, including empty-net scores, entering the postseason, the Golden Knights enjoyed back-to-back high-scoring outings to start the playoffs on a roll. The Knights, who only scored 11 goals combined through the eight games in February, outscored the Dutchmen 13-5 and equaled their single-game high in Friday's 8-3 victory. Clarkson followed with another balanced effort in Saturday's 5-2 triumph. Junior center *Mac Faulkner* (King City, ONT, who was named *INCH National Offensive Player of the Week*, led the Knights with three goals and three assists in the sweep.

Clarkson, which improved its record to 15-16-5, is playing its best hockey at the right time having won four of its last five games.

The ninth-seeded Knights, who finished with an 8-12-2 ECAC mark, will have the opportunity to avenge their lone loss in that span, a 2-1 setback at Cornell on February 28. Clarkson travels to Ithaca, NY to battle the number two seeded Big Red in the best-of-three quarterfinal series this weekend at Lynah Rink. The other ECAC Quarterfinal series are #10 St. Lawrence at #1 Colgate. #6 Harvard at #3 Brown and #5 Rensselaer at #4 Dartmouth.

The winners of the quarterfinals will travel to Albany for the 43rd ECAC Championship Tournament to be held at the Pepsi Center on March 19-20.

Clarkson has been a perennial power in the ECAC since the league was formed at the start of the 1961-62 season. The Knights, who have participated in 42 of the conference's 43 postseason tournaments, own a 68-50-5 record in the ECAC playoffs.

The *Big Red of Cornell*, defending ECAC champions, are looking to set the ground work for their record 11th conference tournament title as they host the quarterfinal round for the fifth consecutive year. Guided by ninth-year head coach *Mike Schafer*, Cornell placed second in the regular season, one point out of first with a 13-6-3 ECAC mark. Overall the Big Red are 15-8-6. Cornell, which enjoyed a first round bye last week, is also playing some of its best hockey entering the playoffs. The Big Red closed out the regular season by winning seven of their last eight games, including a sweep of North Country foes St. Lawrence (4-1) and Clarkson in the final weekend of the regular season. Cornell, which allowed just seven goals combined in those last seven wins, boasts the number-one ranked scoring defense in the conference, allowing just 1.45 goals per game. The Big Red, who went 15-0-0 at Lynah Rink last year en route to a 2004 NCAA Frozen Four appearance, are 6-5-5 at home this season, but have won their last four games in Ithaca.



THE SERIES:

Clarkson's most familiar opponent in the ECAC playoffs, the Knights and Big Red have played 19 times in the league's postseason tournament with Cornell owning a 12-6-1 lead. The Big Red have won three straight over Clarkson in the playoffs with their last meeting in the 2000 preliminary game in Lake Placid, a 4-2 Cornell victory. The Knights hold a 4-3-1 advantage in the quarterfinal round. Clarkson swept the Big Red in the 1995 quarterfinals (6-2 and 7-2) at Cheel Arena for their last wins in postseason over Cornell.

Clarkson leads the all-time series, which began with a 0-0 tie in Ithaca during the 1922-23 campaign, 44-42-9, but Cornell has had the upper hand recently with a six-game unbeaten streak (5-0-1) and an 8-1-1 mark over the past 10 games. The Big Red took three of four points during the regular season, tying the Knights 2-2 in Potsdam on November 14 and winning 2-1 at Lynah Rink on February 28. The Knights snapped a four-game losing streak to Cornell in their first meeting this season. Clarkson held a 2-1 lead midway through the third period on goals by *Tristan Lush* and *John Sullivan* before the Big Red forced overtime with the tying score at 8:04 of the third. In the final game of the regular season in Ithaca two weeks ago, the Big Red gained the one-goal victory scoring power-play goals in the first and third periods around freshman defenseman *Nathan Beausoleil's* second period power-play marker. The Knights' last win over Cornell was a 2-0 shutout at Cheel on February 24, 2001. Clarkson's last win over the Big Red in Ithaca was a 4-1 triumph on March 6, 1999. *Rob McFeeters* has been the top offensive threat for the Green and Gold against the Big Red with six points (2-4) through seven games.

FIRST ROUND UNION SERIES RECAP:

With a convincing 8-3 victory over Union College in the opening game of the first round of the ECAC playoffs, Clarkson entered the postseason with a flurry Friday night in Schenectady. Five Knights scored goals in the win, which snapped a four-game postseason losing streak for Clarkson, as the Green and Gold equaled their highest goal output of the season. Clarkson opened the scoring at 8:46 of the first as the #10, #11, #12 Line converged on the Union crease to knock in a rebound for a power-play goal. Junior *Chris Blight* (Cambridge, ONT) chipped away at a loose puck and slipped in his 15th goal of the season with linemates, junior *Mac Faulkner* (King City, ONT) and freshman *Mike Sullivan* (Stouffville, ONT) assisting on the man-advantage marker, which snapped a streak of 27 consecutive power plays killed by the Dutchmen. Union tied it up at 10:01, but the Knights controlled the remainder of the contest, connecting for five unanswered goals. Sophomore *Jeff Genovy* (Kalamazoo, MI) closed out the first by converting a pass into the slot from behind the net by classmate *John Sullivan* (New Bedford, NH) for his second goal of the year with 2:49 remaining as both teams were skating four aside. Junior *Lyon Porter* (Shaker Heights, OH) opened the middle frame with his first goal as a Golden Knight at 8:01, knocking in a rebound off a shot by freshman *Jamie McKinven* (Kingston, ONT). Juniors *Jay Latulippe* (Saratoga Springs, NY), off a pretty feed from senior *Jean Desrochers* (Dalhousie, QUE), and Faulkner also scored in the second as Clarkson built its lead to 5-1 through 40 minutes of play. Trailing by four goals and skating on a five-minute power play midway through the third, Union pulled its goaltender for a two-man advantage, but the Knights made the most of the Dutchmen's empty net, by sandwiching two shorthanded goals around a Union power-play score. Blight scored his second of the game and team-high 16th of the year, finding the unguarded Union cage at 9:48. The Dutchmen scored a power-play goal at 10:07, but Clarkson came back with another empty-net score at 10:58 as Faulkner tallied his 13th of the season. The Dutchmen added another power-play goal at 17:20, but with 36 seconds left Porter closed out the Knights' convincing win with his second goal of the game. Sophomore *Dustin Traylen* (Kirkland, QUE) was solid in the Clarkson goal once again with a 21-save effort. Traylen's best save of the night came early in the second when he turned aside a Union breakaway attempt. Moments later the Knights went on to score three straight.

Another balanced scoring effort and the continued solid play in goal by Traylen led Clarkson to a 5-2 victory Saturday and a sweep over the Dutchmen in the first round. Five different Knights scored goals and Traylen posted 26 saves, including 13 in the third period. Clarkson jumped out to a 3-0 first-period lead on goals from Faulkner, Blight and senior co-captain *Tristan Lush* (North Andover, MA). The Knights' leading scorer, Faulkner tallied his 14th goal of the season on a quick turn around shot from the bottom of the right circle at 3:33. Blight followed with his team-high 17th goal of the year when he one-timed a shot from the point for a power-play goal at 7:20. Lush completed the Knights' first-period outburst by finishing off a 2-on-1 from classmate *Jean Desrochers* (Dalhousie, QUE) at 14:15. After a scoreless second period, the Dutchmen made the game close in the third by trading two goals apiece with Clarkson.

Union scored its first goal just 44 seconds in. Sophomore defenseman *Chris Brekelmans* (London, ONT) tallied on the power play when his shot from the point deflect in off a Dutchmen defender in front at 8:30. Union scored again at 13:54, but just 62 seconds later, Latulippe sealed the Clarkson win with his second goal of the weekend and 13th of the year. The Knights were solid on the power play, going 2-of-8 with the man-advantage, while killing off all nine Dutchmen power plays.

QUOTES FROM THE COACHES:

"I thought for six periods we played really well," said **George Roll** about the first round series at Union. "It is the first time really where we put back-to-back solid games together. We got another strong goaltending performance from Dustin Traylen, balanced scoring and strong specialty teams play. We got a lot of good efforts from a lot of different guys. I certainly thought that Mac Faulkner and Chris Blight brought their "A" games. They are back to the way they were during the first half of the year. I thought Ken Scuderi had a very good weekend. He was strong defensively and played physical, as did Chris Brekelmans. Dustin was Dustin. He made the key saves when we needed them."

That is the type of effort we are going to continue to have if we are going to continue to have success this weekend at Cornell. We just got done playing in that building. For our freshman, it will not be their first taste of Lynah Rink. It is still fresh in their minds. I think we were a little intimidated there two weeks ago, but I don't think that will be the case this time. We had a lot of guys step it up this past weekend and I feel pretty confident in our play going into the quarterfinals."

KNIGHT NOTES

Sixteen different Knights recorded points in a balanced effort against Union with five separate goal scorers in each game over the weekend. The Knights' upperclassmen made a big impact with the seniors and juniors accounting for 11 of the 13 goals ... Clarkson's top two scorers, **Mac Faulkner** and **Chris Blight** broke out of scoring slumps with career-best outings against the Dutchmen. After recording just a combined two points (1-1) through the month of February, Faulkner (3-3) and Blight (3-1) combined for 10 points in the first-round series sweep ... The Knights' leading scorer, Faulkner, who did not score a goal in February, recorded a career-high four points on two goals, including a shorthanded tally, and two assists in Friday's 8-3 win and then followed with one goal and one assist in Saturday's 5-2 victory. Faulkner was honored with *Inside College Hockey's Offensive Player of the Week National Award*. With 39 points, including a team-high 25 assists, Faulkner is bidding to become the first Clarkson player to record 40 points in a season since current NHL standout **Erik Cole** produced 41 points in the 1998-99 campaign. He was also named to the *ECAC* weekly **Honor Roll** ... Blight, Clarkson's leading goal-scorer, recorded three goals and an assist in the sweep of the Dutchmen. He equaled a career-high three points when he tallied a shorthanded goal and a power-play marker along with one assist on Friday. He also scored on the power play in Saturday's victory to give him 17 goals on the season ... **Dustin Traylen**, who owns one of the best single-season save percentages in Clarkson history at .921, posted 47 saves in the sweep of Union. His biggest stop came in game one with Clarkson holding a 2-1 lead early in the second. He stoned a Dutchmen breakaway attempt and the Knights then went on to score three straight goals to close out the period with a 5-1 advantage. Traylen was also named to the *ECAC Honor Roll* ... Clarkson's most productive offensive player in February, **Jay Latulippe**, from nearby Saratoga Springs, NY, continued his solid play at Union. He scored the game-winning goal on Friday and netted a goal and an assist in Saturday's victory ... Senior **Tristan Lush**, who sat out Friday's game along with fellow co-captain Rob McFeeters because several players violated team policy last weekend, responded with one goal and one assist in

Saturday's win and equaled the Clarkson record for most career games played at 143 ... Junior **Lyon Porter**, who transferred to Clarkson this season from Fairfield University, scored his first goals as a Golden Knight with a two-goal, one-assist effort in Friday's victory ... **Jeff Genovy** also enjoyed a career-best game in Friday's win with one goal and one assist after scoring just six points (1-5) during the regular season ... **Trevor Edwards** (Carelton Place, ONT) recorded a season-high two assists on Saturday ... Freshman **Mike Sullivan** (Stouffville, ONT) rounded out a solid showing by the #10, #11, #12 Line with three assists on the weekend. The Knights' leading rookie scorer with 18 points (7-11), Sullivan was named *ECAC Rookie of the Week* ... Freshman **Jamie McKinven** (Kingston, ONT) posted a career-high two assists on Friday for his first points in the Knights' last 11 games ... Rookie blueliner **Michael Grenzy** (Lockport, NY) picked up an assist in both games of the playoffs ... **Randy Jones**, an ECAC All-Star on defense last year as a sophomore for Clarkson, made his NHL debut when he was called up from the AHL to play for the Philadelphia Flyers on Saturday.

RENSELAER, HARVARD, CLARKSON AND ST. LAWRENCE ADVANCE COLGATE, CORNELL, BROWN AND DARTMOUTH HOST THIS WEEKEND'S QUARTERFINALS

CAPE COD, Mass. - The first round of the 2004 ECAC Hockey Championship saw No. 5 Rensselaer, No. 6 Harvard, No. 9 Clarkson and No. 10 St. Lawrence sweep their opponents to advance to the Quarterfinals.

Rensselaer vs. Princeton

Despite a Princeton rally in the third period, Rensselaer defeated the Tigers 5-4 on Friday night at the Houston Field House. The Engineers took an early lead when Ryan Shields snuck one past Eric Leroux after a failed clearing attempt by the Tigers at 4:54 in the first. Kevin Croxton scored the first of three RPI power-play goals at 6:26 in the second and Princeton's Sebastian Borza scored on an RPI failed clearing attempt to cut the lead by one. Harvard shut out Vermont in game one of the series, 3-0. Kevin Du opened the scoring for the Crimson with a rebound shot sent in his direction at 1:40 in the first. Tyler Kolarik made it 2-0 after a scramble in front of the net on the power play. Ryan Maki's shot seconds after a line change at 11:06 in the third gave Harvard the 3-0 win. Vermont's Travis Russell made 18 saves for the Cats, while Dov Grumet-Morris stopped 19 shots.

Down 4-0 in the third period, Princeton made Grumet-Morris work hard for his 5-3 win as they peppered him with shots. Brendan Bernakevitch scored two back-to-back goals for the Crimson and Rob Fried wristed a shot from the point for the 3-0 lead at the close of the second. Dennis Packard tipped the puck in past Russell at 4:24 of the third for the 4-0 lead. Scott Misfud sparked the Tiger offense as he scored two consecutive goals, one on a 5x3 with a player in the box and an extra attacker. With Russell still on the bench, Jaime Sifers beat Grumet-Morris to cut the lead back. Fried spoiled Vermont's third-period efforts as he scored on the empty net with 51 seconds remaining for the 5-3 victory. Russell made 25 saves for the Cats and Grumet-Morris stopped 21 for the win.

Re-seeded to No. 6, Harvard will take on No. 3 Brown in the quarterfinals in the selected televised contest.

Clarkson vs. Union

No. 9 Clarkson upset the No. 8 Dutchmen of Union in two at Messa Rink. The Knights took an 8-3 win on Friday and a 5-2 victory on Saturday. Mac Faulkner led Clarkson with four points, and Chris Blight and Lyon Porter had three-point efforts. Blight opened the scoring with a power-play goal at 8:46 in the first. Union's Matt Vagvolgyi answered back minutes later, but Jeff Genovy snuck one past Kris Mayotte for the 2-1 lead at the close of the first. Porter, Jay Latulippe, and Faulkner each had scores in the second period to stack the lead to 5-1. With Mayotte pulled for the extra attacker and Clarkson's Latulippe given a 10-minute game misconduct the contest saw three goals in just over one minute. Blight intercepted the puck and skated in on the empty net for a short-handed goal, Jonathan Poirier gave the Dutchmen a power-play goal, and Faulkner intercepted the puck for the Knights second short-handed empty-net goal of the game. Poirier had his second power-play tally of the night at 17:20. Porter scored his second of the night and on the season with 35 seconds remaining for the 8-3 victory. Dustin Traylen made 21 saves for the Knights, and Mayotte stopped 14 for the Dutchmen.

Clarkson scored three first-period goals and never looked back as they skated to a 5-2 win on Saturday. Faulkner, Blight and Tristan Lush each scored for the Knights to take a 3-0 lead at the close of the first. After a scoreless second, Jordan Webb got the Dutchmen on the board at 0:44 in the third. Chris Brekelmans shot from the point was deflected past the goal line at 8:30. Jason Visser added the final Union goal at 13:54, one minute before Latulippe knocked one past Mayotte for the win. Mayotte made 18 saves, and Tim Roth stopped four in the ten minutes he came in on net after a 10-minute misconduct was called on Mayotte. Traylen stacked the pads on 26 shots for Clarkson.

Clarkson, who has been re-seeded as the No. 7 seed will travel to Lynah Rink to take on No. 2 Cornell.

St. Lawrence vs. Yale

No. 10 St. Lawrence upset No. 7 Yale as the Saints claimed two overtime victories over the Elis. Just 14 seconds off the opening face-off Ryan Steeves snuck one past Mike McKenna. St. Lawrence's Jeremy Cormier and Drew Bagnall had two scores in the first period on Saturday to take the lead. Vin Hellemeyer scored on a rebound of a Christian Jensen breakaway to trail by one. Rich Peverley's slap shot on the power-play gave the Saints another two-goal lead. Jensen wristed in a redirection on McKenna and Hellemeyer added another goal for Yale as the Elis added an extra attacker. TEAM NOTES



BROWN ●Coming off a 6-0 victory over Vermont last weekend, Brown will host travel-partner Harvard in a best-of-three ECAC Quarterfinal series.

●Brown swept the regular season series from Harvard, winning 2-0 in Cambridge, and 2-1 (ot) in Providence.

●Brown and Harvard faced each other in the 2001-2002 ECAC Playoffs, with Harvard knocking off the Bears, two-games-to-none in the quarterfinals, a series played in Cambridge.

●Harvard won the first game 4-1, before beating the Bears 2-1 in double-overtime in the decisive game. Senior Yann Danis, then a sophomore, stopped 66 shots in the loss, second all-time at Brown for saves in a single game.

●Brown has faced Harvard seven times in the ECAC Playoffs, including the two games in 2002. However, Brown has never hosted Harvard in any of those meetings.

●Friday's game against Harvard will mark the 141st meeting between the Bears and the Crimson, college hockey's oldest active rivalry. The Crimson lead the all-time series with Brown by a 96-36-8 margin, with the Bears winning the past two games. Brown and Harvard first met in 1898 with Brown defeating Harvard, 6-0, and have faced each other 139 times since. Brown Head Coach Roger Grillo is 6-9-1 against the Crimson, while Harvard's Mark Mazzoleni is 7-5-0 against Brown.

●Senior Brent Robinson tallied four points against Vermont, bringing his career total to 97 points, three away from 100. The last people to notch 100 career points were Ryan Mulhern '96 (118) and Brian Jardine '96 (106).

●With his 43rd career win, senior Yann Danis tied the Brown record for wins in a career, set by Kevin McCabe. He now needs just one more win to break the record.

●Freshman Brian Ihnacak leads the team with 30 points (10g,20a) in 29 games. He is Brown's first freshman since 1975-76 to notch at least 30 points in a season. Senior Brent Robinson is second on the team with 29 points (11g,18a) and leads the team with 11 goals, while junior Les Haggett is third with 28 points (5g,23a), and leads the team with 23 assists. Senior Scott Ford is fourth with 15 points, and leads all defensemen, while senior Vince Macri is fifth with 14 points.

●Senior Hobey Baker candidate Yann Danis leads the league goalies with a .946 save percentage (overall) and .948 save percentage (ECAC only). He is second with a 1.70 GAA (overall) and a 1.63 GAA (ECAC only).

●In Brown's 15 wins this season, a different player has scored each goal of the game, with the exception of the first Yale, Princeton, and St. Lawrence games, and the second Princeton and Vermont games. No player on the team has more than 30 points or more than 11 goals. In addition, 18 different players have tallied at least one point with 17 with at least two points.

●The senior class leads the way in offensive production with 77 (38.9%)points, while the junior class is next with 58 (29.3%) points. The freshman class has 44 (22.2%) points, and the sophomore class adds 19 (9.6%) points.

●Brown's special teams have been strong this season, going 33-155 (21.3) on the power-play, 7th in the country, and 137-151 (90.7) on the penalty kill, 1st in the country.



CLARKSON ●Clarkson is coming off its most impressive efforts of

the season, winning two games on the same weekend against an ECAC opponent for the first time this season with the first round series

sweep at Union College. The Golden Knights, who only scored 11 goals combined through the eight games in February, outscored the Dutchmen 13-5 and equaled their single-game high in Friday's 8-3 victory ... Clarkson, which improved its ECAC postseason record to 68-50-5, advances to the quarterfinal round for the 41st time in the 43 years of the ECAC playoffs. The Knights will battle defending ECAC champion Cornell

●Clarkson's most familiar opponent in the ECAC playoffs, the Knights and Big Red have played 19 times in the league's post-season tournament with Cornell owning a 12-6-1 lead. The Big Red have won three straight over Clarkson in the playoffs with their last meeting in the 2000 preliminary game in Lake Placid, a 4-2 Cornell victory. The Knights hold a 4-3-1 advantage in the quarterfinal round. Clarkson swept the Big Red in the 1995 quarterfinals (6-2 and 7-2) at Cheel Arena for their last wins in post-season over Cornell.

●Clarkson leads the all-time series, which began with a 0-0 tie in Ithaca during the 1922-23 campaign, 44-42-9, but Cornell has had the upper hand recently with a six-game unbeaten streak (5-0-1) and an 8-1-1 mark over the past 10 games. The Big Red took three of four points during the regular season, tying the Knights 2-2 in Potsdam on November 14 and winning 2-1 at Lynah Rink on February 28. The Knights snapped a four-game losing streak to Cornell in their first meeting this season. Clarkson held a 2-1 lead midway through the third period on goals by Tristan Lush and John Sullivan before the Big Red forced overtime with the tying score at 8:04 of the third. In the final game of the regular season in Ithaca two weeks ago, the Big Red gained the one-goal victory scoring power-play goals in the first and third periods around freshman defenseman Nathan Beausoleil second period power-play marker. The Knights' last win over Cornell was a 2-0 shutout at Cheel on February 24, 2001. Clarkson last win over the Big Red in Ithaca was a 4-1 triumph on March 6, 1999. Rob McFeeters has been the top offensive threat for the Green and Gold against the Big Red with six points (2-4) through seven games.

●Fifteen different Knights recorded points in a balanced effort against Union with five separate goal scorers in each game over the weekend ... Clarkson's top two scorers, Mac Faulkner and Chris Blight broke out of scoring slumps with career-best outings against the Dutchmen. After recording just a combined two points (1-1) through the month of February, Faulkner (3-3) and Blight (3-1) combined for 10 points in the first-round series sweep ... The Knights' leading scorer, Faulkner, who did not score a goal in February, recorded a career-high four points on two goals, including a shorthanded tally, and two assists in Friday's 8-3 win and then followed with one goal and one assist in Saturday's 5-2 victory. With 39 points, including a team-high 25 assists, Faulkner is bidding to become the first Clarkson player to record 40 points in a season since current NHL standout Erik Cole produced 41 points in the 1998-99 campaign ... Blight, Clarkson's leading goal-scorer, recorded three goals and an assist in the sweep of the Dutchmen. He equaled a career-high three points when he tallied a shorthanded goal and a power-play marker along with one assist on Friday. He also scored on the

power play in Saturday's victory to give him 17 goals on the season ... Dustin Traylen, who owns one of the best single-season save percentages in Clarkson history at .921, posted 47 saves in the sweep of Union. His biggest stop came in game one with Clarkson holding a 2-1 lead early in the second. He stoned a Dutchmen breakaway attempt and the Knights then went on to score three straight goals to close out the period with a 5-1 advantage ... Clarkson's most productive offensive player in February, Jay Latulippe, from nearby Saratoga Springs, NY, continued his solid play at Union. He scored the game-winning goal on Friday and netted a goal and an assist in Saturday's victory ... Senior Tristan Lush, who sat out Friday's game along with fellow co-captain Rob McFeeters because several players violated team policy last weekend, responded with one goal and one assist in Saturday's win and equaled the Clarkson record for most career games played at 143 ... Junior Lyon Porter, who transferred to Clarkson this season from Fairfield University, scored his first goals as a Golden Knight with a two-goal, one-assist effort in Friday's victory ... Jeff Genovy also enjoyed a career-best game in Friday's win with one goal and one assist after scoring just six points (1-5) during the regular season ... Randy Jones, an ECAC All-Star on defense last year as a sophomore for Clarkson, made his first appearance in the NHL when he was called up from the AHL to play for the Philadelphia Flyers on Saturday.



COLGATE • As the top seed in the ECAC tournament, Colgate will face St. Lawrence in the quarterfinals this weekend at Starr Rink.

- The two teams split this year's regular season meetings with each team winning at home. The Saints won the first meeting in Canton by a 5-1 score and Colgate won 3-2 two weeks ago in the final regular season game.
- Colgate and St. Lawrence met in the first round of the ECAC Tournament last year with the Raiders winning two of three games. The Saints won the first game by a 2-1 score and Colgate won the next two by 3-2 (OT) and 5-2 scores.
- St. Lawrence leads the overall series between the two teams by a 56-51-3 margin and Colgate leads the series at Starr Rink 27-21-2.
- The longest game in Colgate hockey history occurred last year in the quarterfinals at Dartmouth when sophomore Kyle Wilson scored the game winner at 1:05 of the fourth overtime to give the Raiders a 4-3 win in the opening game of the series.
- Interim head coach Stan Moore boasts a 0-2 mark in the ECAC Tournament while he was a head coach at Union. During the 1996-97 season, the Dutchmen lost to Rensselaer in two games by 3-1 scores in the quarterfinals.
- Sophomore left wing Jon Smyth (Markham, Ont.) and junior goaltender Steve Silverthorn (Owen Sound, Ont.) will lead the Raiders into the tournament. Smyth leads the team in scoring with 39 points on 21 goals and 18 assists in 33 games. Silverthorn boasts a 16-7-4 record and a 1.91 goals against average to go along with a .922 save percentage. Silverthorn is 3-3 in tournament play.



CORNELL • Cornell earned a first-round bye for the ECAC playoffs after sweeping St. Lawrence and Clarkson Feb. 27-28 to claim second place in the final conference standings.

- The Big Red will face Clarkson in the quarterfinals at Lynah Rink this weekend, as the Golden Knights swept Union in the first round of the playoffs. Cornell is the No. 2 seed in the tourney, while Clarkson is the No. 7 seed.
- Cornell and Clarkson have faced each other 95 times since the series started in 1922-23. The Golden Knights hold a slight 44-42-9 advantage in the all-time series. Earlier this year in Potsdam, the Big Red and Golden Knights tied 2-2 and then two weeks ago in Ithaca, Cornell won 2-1. Cornell is 4-0-1 in the last five meetings and 9-1-1 in the last 11. Clarkson is the Big Red's only ECAC opponent that holds an advantage in the all-time series.
- Of all the opponents in the ECAC, Cornell's playoff history with Clarkson is the biggest, as the two teams have battled each other in 19 postseason contests (not including NCAA tournament matchups). In the playoff series, Cornell holds a 12-6-1 advantage, including wins in the last three games. The two teams last met in the 2000 play-in game at Lake Placid, with Cornell winning 4-2. The Big Red also captured wins over the Golden Knights en route to its ECAC titles in 1996 and 1997. The two teams have faced each other in the championship game three times, with Cornell winning all three of those games.
- The Big Red is playing in its 35th ECAC men's ice hockey tournament and has 73 wins in tournament action. Overall, Cornell is 72-32-4 (.685) in the playoffs and has won an ECAC record 10 championships (1967-68-69-70-73-80-86-96-97-2003). The team has won three championships under Coach Mike Schafer, including last year's crown.
- Cornell is making its 11th straight appearance in the ECAC tournament. The Big Red has advanced to the championship round eight out of the last nine years, winning the tournament crown in 1996, 1997 and 2003.
- Two weeks ago against Clarkson, sophomore forward Matt Moulson scored both goals to earn the win for Cornell. Both of his markers were power-play goals. He scored the game winner at 11:43 in the third period. Matt finishes the regular season as Cornell's leading scorer with 34 points on 18 goals and 16 assists in 29 games.
- Freshman goaltender David McKee has a 1.68 goals against average, which is first overall in the ECAC and second in the nation. His save percentage is at .927, which is second overall in the conference and fifth nationally. He finished the ECAC season with a conference-best GAA of 1.37 and a save percentage of .939 (second).
- Junior forward Mike Knoepfli and junior defenseman Charlie Cook also played key roles in the win over Clarkson on Saturday, as the duo assisted on both Matt Moulson goals. They also had one assist each in the win over St. Lawrence, and each now have 13 assists on the year.
- Cornell has one of the nation's top defenses and penalty kills. The defense is ranked second nationally, allowing just 1.76 goals per game, while the penalty kill is fourth nationally at .886.
- If the season were to end today, the Big Red's defense would rank among the top 20 all-time in NCAA history. It also ranks third all time at Cornell and in the ECAC.
- For the season, eight players have at least 10 points on the year, with three players - Matt Moulson (18-16-34), Ryan Vesce (10-

15—25) and Mike Knoepfli (4-16—20) - with more than 20 pointseach.

- So far this season, seven players have tied or surpassed their career numbers. Matt Moulson has a career high 18 goals and 16 assists; Mike Knoepfli's 16 assists ties his career best; Cam Abbott scored on Friday for his career-high eighth goal; Chris Abbott has 10 assists this year, three more than last year; Ben Wallace has a career-high six assists; Jon Gleed has a career high three goals and three assists; and Mike Iggulden has a career-best two goals and four assists.

- The Big Red helped increase the donation to the Ithaca Breast Cancer Alliance through the Power Play for Prevention Program over the weekend with its two power-play goals. The team now has 25 on the year, which gives the IBCA at least \$2,500. Each time the Big Red scores a power-play goal the Tompkins Trust Company will donate \$100 to the IBCA. Independent contributions from fans are also being accepted. Pledge cards are available in the Bartels Hall lobby at every game and can be picked up at any Tompkins Trust Co. branch office. The pledge card is also available on the Cornell hockey web page at: www.CornellBigRed.com.



DARTMOUTH ●For the second year in a row the Dartmouth men's hockey team played the role of spectator as the team sat and watched the first round of playoff games waiting for their contender to emerge.

- This weekend Thompson Arena should be rocking with fans as Dartmouth battles Rensselaer in one of the quarterfinal series. The game marks the first time in two years the Big Green has had to face an opponent other than Colgate in the quarterfinals. Should the Big Green and the Raiders meet, it would be in the championship round in Albany on March 19.

- Dartmouth and Rensselaer ended the regular season in a tie for fourth place but Dartmouth won the tie-breaker by virtue of a tie and a win over the Engineers.

- If the Big Green can earn the victory against Rensselaer it will be the third straight trip to the Championship round for Dartmouth.

- Dartmouth has proven itself at home, going 6-2-4 this year. And Rensselaer has proven to be a much better road team with a 12-6-0 record on its opponents ice.

- In the last seven meetings between the two teams, Dartmouth leads with a 4-1-2 record.

- The series between the Big Green and the Engineers started on Jan. 17, 1908 with a 4-4 tie in Albany. Rensselaer leads the overall series, 33-19-4.

- Statistics between the two teams are pretty comprable. Rensselaer has a slight edge in both power plays (20.5% to 19.4%) and penalty kills (85.0% to 78.8%).

Dartmouth leads the two teams with the most shots on goal per game, 32.2 to 28.8.

- On Nov. 15 early this season Dartmouth traveled to RPI and battled the Engineers to a 1-1 tie. Eric Przepiorka scored the lone goal for the Big Green.

The two teams went two full periods without a score until RPI's Matt McNeely had the first strike with 14:00 minutes gone in the third. Przepiorka evened things up just eight seconds later.

- When Rensselaer traveled to Hanover on Jan. 30 seven total goals marked the high scoring drama that gave Dartmouth the 4-

3 victory.

- With 3:22 gone in the first stanza the Big Green's Mike Turner scored his third goal of the season with Hugh Jessiman adding to total at the 14:51 mark.

- The Engineers evened things up when Brad Farynuk and Scott Basiuk had all the scoring in the second.

- Early in the third, Rensselaer took their first lead of the game when McNeely ripped one into the back of the Dartmouth net. Tanner Glass scored the tying goal for the Big Green with less than five minutes to go in the game and then Dan Shribman potted his second game winner of the season with three minutes left.

- In the preseason poll for the 2003-04 season, Dartmouth was picked to finish third and Rensselaer was picked to finish 10th.



HARVARD ●Harvard swept Vermont out of the playoffs for the second consecutive season, posting 3-0, 5-3 victories to advance into the quarterfinals against Brown. The Crimson got balanced scoring and played outstanding defense, limiting Vermont's scoring

to a the third period of the second game.

- The senior class will graduate with a perfect home record in ECAC Tournament games. The class of 2004 closed the books with an 8-0 record, and improved its overall mark to 12-2 in the ECAC Tournament.

- Harvard owns a 6-1-0 record against Brown in its ECAC Tournament history, which includes a perfect 5-0 mark in quarterfinal matchups. The most recent meeting came in 2002, when the Crimson swept Brown at the Bright Center. The second game of that matchup at the time was the longest game in Harvard history, and Brown netminder Yann Danis set the Harvard school record for saves by an opposing goaltender (66). Dominic Moore ended that game with a supreme individual effort at 94:11.

- In what will hopefully be an omen, the Crimson has gone on to win the ECAC title in each of the seasons it has played Brown in the quarterfinals (1971, 1987, and 2002)

- The Crimson owns a 38-15-4 record all-time in the ECAC Quarterfinals, including six straight wins. The last road quarterfinal series came in 2000, where Harvard dropped twin 4-3 decisions to Cornell at Lynah.

- Mark Mazzoleni increased his ECAC Tournament coaching record to 12-4-0. He has brought his teams to the ECAC "final four" in each of the last three seasons, and into the title game the last two.

- Harvard is tied with Clarkson for the second-most ECAC Tournament victories (67), four behind Cornell's 71.

- Harvard's penalty kill has been outstanding over the last few games. Vermont scored a pair of goals late on Saturday (one six-on-three, one six-on-four), snapping a streak of 21 consecutive penalties killed, dating back to the Vermont game the last weekend of the regular season.

- Eight of the 30 power play goals the Crimson has allowed this season - more than a quarter - were scored by Vermont.

- Harvard leads the all-time series with the Bears 96-34-8, with Brown taking three of the last four decisions - a sweep this season (2-0 and 2-1 in OT), and a split last season, with Brown taking a 4-0 win in the opener at Bright and the Crimson winning 3-1 in Providence.

- The Crimson has allowed just two goals while skating five-on-

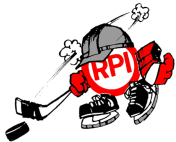

five in the last four games.

- Dov Grumet-Morris set a modern Harvard record for consecutive shutout minutes, as his streak reached 184:35 before a Scott Mifsud tally ended the string at 4:55 of the third period. Grumet-Morris pitched the first back-to-back Harvard shutouts since the 1986-87 season (4-0 against Dartmouth on 2/28 and 3-0 against Vermont on 3/5) He took a shutout into the third period of Saturday's game.
- Grumet-Morris improved his ECAC Tournament statistics to a 1.69 GAA and .935 save percentage.
- Tyler Kolarik continues to rise to the occasion in big games, extending his ECAC playoff scoring to 6-13-19. Dennis Packard is the active career leader in ECAC Tournament goals (7).
- Saturday's game featured a pair of two goal scorers in the same game for the first time since last February. Brendan Bernakevitch and Rob Fried each had a pair of goals in the 5-3 victory.
- Kolarik leads the way this season with nine multiple-point games, with Tom Cavanagh and Tim Pettit each getting eight.
- Pettit will likely break the school record for career games played this weekend in the two-game set at Brown. Friday will be game #131 for the winger, tying him with former Crimson captain Steve Armstrong '88. Dennis Packard (126 gms) and Tyler Kolarik (125) joined the school's top ten list this weekend.
- Along the same vein, Tom Cavanagh and Ryan Lannon will likely become the first juniors to skate in their 100th career games. Cavanagh is scheduled to hit the milestone on Friday, while Lannon will join him on Saturday.
- Of the last 16 goals scored, half were netted by underclassmen, six of them by freshmen. First-year Ryan Maki leads the charge with three tallies, while classmate Kevin Du and sophomore Charlie Johnson each have two.
- Four players have already surpassed their single-season best point totals this year: Tom Cavanagh (30), Brendan Bernakevitch (23), Dennis Packard (21) and blueliner Peter Hafner (6).
- Harvard had three players named to All-Ivy teams last week. Noah Welch is a second team selection, while Tim Pettit and Tom Cavanagh were honorable mention picks.

RENSSELAER ●With Friday night's win, the Engineers posted their fourth 20-win season in the past six years.

- Rensselaer has won four straight games for the first time this season. Its longest unbeaten streak is five games (4-0-1 from Nov. 14 to Nov. 28). The Engineers have won seven of their last nine games.
- RPI has won five straight road games, allowing two or fewer goals in each of those contests. Over their last seven away games, the Engineers are 6-1-0 with the only loss coming at Dartmouth (4-3). On the season, Rensselaer is 10-6-0 on the road, including an 8-3-0 mark during ECAC play.
- RPI has allowed three or fewer goals in ten of its last 11 games (8-3-0).

- Following last weekend's games against Princeton, the Engineers are now 16-2-2 when scoring first, 9-9-0 in one-goal games, 13-4-1 on Saturdays and 3-0-2 in overtime games.
- RPI's 44 shots on Saturday were the most in a game this season.
- Rensselaer has six players who have 20 or more points.
- Junior forward Nick Economakos (Lockport, IL) has at least one point (2 goals, 4 assists) in three of his last four games. He had two goals and three assists in the series against Princeton.
- Senior defenseman Scott Basiuk (Prince Albert, SASK) has four points (1 goal, 3 assists) in his last four games.
- Three forwards had three-game point streaks snapped on Saturday. They were freshman Oren Eizenman (Toronto, ONT), who had two goals and four assists, sophomore Kirk MacDonald (Victoria, BC), who had a goal and four assists, and senior Ryan Shields (Portage LaPrairie, BC), who had two goals and two assists.
- Sophomore forward Kevin Croxton (Calgary, ALB) had a four-game point streak (5 goals, 3 assists) ended on Saturday. He has now been held without a point in nine games this season. RPI is 19-7-1 when Croxton has at least one point.
- Saturday's game marked the sixth time this season that neither Kevin Croxton (Calgary, ALB) nor Kirk MacDonald (Victoria, BC) registered a point. Rensselaer is 1-4-1 in those games.
- Senior goaltender Nathan Marsters (Grimsby, ONT) has started each of the last 19 games, posting a 13-6-0 record. He is currently eleventh in the nation in goals against average (2.12) and fourteenth in save percentage (.920).
- The Engineers will play a weekend playoff series at Dartmouth this weekend. Rensselaer was 0-1-1 against the Big Green this season. The two teams tied, 1-1, on Nov. 15 in Troy and Dartmouth won, 4-3, on Jan. 30 in Hanover.
- RPI and Dartmouth have met in the playoffs three times in recent years. In 1999-00, the Engineers swept a first round series at the Houston Field House (7-2 & 3-2 OT). The Big Green turned the tables the following year, winning 4-2 and 5-1 in a first round series in New Hampshire. In 2001-02, RPI defeated Dartmouth, 2-1, in the ECAC play-in game at Lake Placid.
- Rensselaer head coach Dan Fridgen is 14-10-2 in his career against the Big Green.
- RPI is eighth in the nation in scoring defense (2.25 goals against per game), scoring margin (0.89) and power play percentage (20.5). Rensselaer is thirteenth nationally in penalty killing (86.0%).
- Individually, sophomore forward Kevin Croxton (Calgary, ALB) is second in the nation in power play goals with 12. Teammate Kirk MacDonald (Victoria, BC) is twelfth with eight.
- Senior defenseman Scott Basiuk (Prince Albert, SASK) is tenth in the U.S. in points per game by a defenseman with 0.71.

ST. LAWRENCE

●An Encore?: St. Lawrence University swept Yale with a pair of 4-3 overtime victories in New Haven to advance to the ECAC quarterfinals at regular season champion Colgate. The sweep of Yale marks the first time since 1964 that

the Saints have advanced as a road team in the ECAC playoffs and the two wins were the third and fourth for the Saints as a visiting team in their tournament history. The Saint tournament trail heads through Hamilton for the second straight season as SLU played an opening round series at Colgate last year, winning the first before Colgate came back with an overtime win in game two and clinched the series with a Sunday night victory. A trip to the ECAC semifinals is at stake this time around.

●The Yale Series: The last time the Saints and Yale met in a playoff series in New Haven (1998) it was a memorable three-game set as the two tied each of the first two games 3-3 after five minute overtimes were played before Yale won the third game to advance. This time around 3-3 was again the magic score after regulation, but the Saints were able to pull out 4-3 overtime victories as Stace Page ended the first game, the longest in Yale history, with his second of the night at 18:42 of the first overtime and Rich Peverley won the second game 5:14 into the extra period, converting a breakaway for the Saints first and only shot of the extra period. The Friday night overtime victory for the Saints snapped a streak of 17 overtime games without a win for the Saints, who were 0-3-14 before taking the back-to-back victories. The games were the third and fourth one-goal games between the Saints and Elis this season as Yale won the regular season meetings 4-3 in overtime in New Haven and 5-4 in Canton. Eight of the last ten games between the two teams have been one-goal games and five of those have been 4-3 scores.

●The Colgate Games: The Saints will have to continue their post-season success on the road if they are to make the semifinals in Albany for the first time since the tournament moved to that venue. The Saints and Raiders will meet for the second straight year in the tournament, but for just the third time in the post-season history when they tangle in the quarterfinals beginning on Friday. Colgate won a 4-3 preliminary round game in 1994 and took last seasons series two games to one as the Saints won the opener 2-1 before the Raiders took a 3-2 overtime decision in game two and clinched the series with a 5-2 win in the Sunday game. All of the playoff meetings between the teams have been played in Hamilton. The two teams split in the regular season this year with the Saints winning 5-1 in Canton and Colgate taking a 3-2 decision in Hamilton. St. Lawrence leads the all time series between the teams 56-51-1, but the Saints have won just twice in their last 11 trips to Starr Rink. The two teams tied 4-4 and the Saints won the first of the playoff series last year before Colgate won the second and third playoff games and the other Saint win came on Jan. 25, 2001 when the Saints posted a 4-0 shutout win.

●By the Numbers: The Saints are now 2-0-0 on the road in their "second season." For the entire campaign the Saints are now 4-12-2 in road games. The Saints scored the opening goal in the second Yale playoff game and are now 11-6-5 when scoring first. The Saints are now 10-1-2 when scoring four or more goals and 12-4-3 when scoring three or more.

●Special Teams: The Saints are scoring at a 15 percent clip on the power play overall after scoring twice in seven tries at Yale last weekend. They are seven for 32, a 21.8 percent success rate, over

the last seven games. The Saints killed five of seven Yale power play opportunities on the weekend and have been successful on the kill 27 times in the last 32 chances, an 84.3 percent success rate. Each team killed off a five minute major in the first of the two Yale playoff games although the Saints scored almost exactly as the Yale major ended. The butt-ending call on goalie Josh Gartner was made 56 seconds into the second period and Stace Page scored the tying goal at 5:57 of the second. Yale's power play goal in Saturday's second game came with 14 seconds to go on the power play and on the only power play shot Yale had in three attempts.

●Odds and Ends: John Zeiler extended his point scoring streak to nine games as he had three assists in the two games including the assist on Rich Peverley's game-winning breakaway as his thread the needle pass hit the Saint captain on the tape just outside the Yale blue line. Other Saints with active streaks include T.J. Trevelyan, who has scored in eight straight, Drew Bagnall, who has scored in three straight and Peverley, who has scored in two straight and five of his last six. The Peverley-Trevelyan-Zeiler line remains the top scoring line overall in the ECAC and Peverley took over the ECAC overall scoring lead with his four point weekend. Peverley now has 16 goals and 25 assists for 41 points establishing career highs in goals, assists and points. He is bidding to become the fifth player in Saint hockey history to lead the team in scoring for three straight years and heads into the Colgate series with a two point lead on linemate Trevelyan who is among four players tied for second in scoring in the ECAC with 39 points. Trevelyan is the ECAC goal scoring leader with 23 and leads the ECAC and the nation in power play goals with 13. He is eighth nationally in goals scored. Zeiler is eighth among all ECAC players in scoring with 35 points on eight goals and 27 assists with his 27 assists leading all ECAC players. Mike McKenna has now started 11 consecutive games for the Saints and has a 2.10 goals against average and a .932 save percentage in those 11 games. He is 5-4-2 in that stretch.
