2004-05 SEASON in REVIEW



A frustrating season for *Clarkson University* came to a close in Ithaca, NY in early March when the *Golden Knights* forced the third-ranked team in the nation to the brink on its home ice only to fall one goal short in overtime in their bid to make a return trip to Albany for the *ECACHL* Championship Tournament. The Knights, guided by second-year head coach *George Roll*, associate coach *Greg Drechsel* and assistant coach *Jean-Francois Houle*, forced regular-season champion Cornell to overtime in game 2 of the league quarterfinal series at Lynah Rink, but the Big Red prevailed with the winning score at the 12-minute mark of overtime to gain a 3-2 victory, ending Clarkson's season with a 13-23-3 overall record. The Knights, who played in four postseason overtime contests including two extra-session wins (1-0, 4-3) in first-round action at Union, were the ninth seed in the league playoffs after posting a 7-13-2 conference mark.

"I am kind of torn," stated Roll about the Knights' season-ending loss at Cornell. "We played awfully hard and I am very proud of our effort, but I am also disappointed. If we would have had that effort game in and game out, our season would have been much different. Hopefully we learned a lesson that you just can't go through the regular season the way we did. We gave Cornell everything they could handle on Saturday night, but on the other hand we needed to bring that effort every night in order to turn our regular season around and get a better path to Albany."

Clarkson had some impressive outings during the course of the season. The Knights tied (3-3ot) and defeated (3-1) top-10 ranked Ohio State at *Cheel Arena*, took three of four points from ECACHL rivals Colgate (3-1, 3-3ot) and Vermont (1-1ot, 3-2), handed pre-season favorite Dartmouth a 4-1 loss in Potsdam and extended its unbeaten streak over Princeton to 16-games with a sweep (3-2, 3-1) over the improving Tigers. Those highlights, however, were overshadowed by inconsistent efforts, which left the *Green and Gold* struggling throughout the 2004-05 campaign.

Two clutch goals by *Jay Latulippe* and a solid effort in goal by *Dustin Traylen* enabled Clarkson to tie the USA Under-18 Developmental team in an exhibition contest on the Knights' first official day on the ice for the 2004-05 campaign. Latulippe tallied his second goal of the game with 1:40 to play in the third period, lifting in a rebound off a shot by freshman *Nick Dodge* while the *Golden Knights* were on the power play. Traylen finished with 38 saves. Clarkson took the lead to open the game when Latulippe scored off a soft backhand shot at the top of the crease after taking a behind-the-net pass from freshman *Matt Isbister* at 15:29.

Clarkson came up short in its season-opener, falling to Providence College in a penalty-filled contest. The Friars made the most of their early man-advantage chances, scoring back-to-back power-play goals at 5:45 and 7:19. *Mike Sullivan* notched a goal, which came during a delayed penalty, at 17:37 to make the score 2-1 after the first. The Friars went on top 3-1 early in the second with a four-on-four score at 3:41. Freshman *Nick Dodge* made it a one-goal game with his first collegiate point, a power-play marker at 7:11. The Friars went back on top by two, at 14:39, with their second goal in a four-on-four situation of the period. The Knights went 1-of-12 on the power play, while Providence was 2-12 with the man-advantage.

Specialty teams played a prominent role in Clarkson's loss at UMass. There were a total of 24 power plays in the game with the Knights going 3-of-12 with the man-advantage, while UMass was 4-for-12. The Minutemen grabbed a 3-2 lead in the first on a pair of power-play tallies and a shorthanded marker. *Jay Latulippe* scored both Clarkson goals in the opening stanza while on the power play. The Knights grabbed the lead in the second period with a power-play goal by *Chris Blight* and freshman *Steve Zalewski*'s first collegiate goal, while both teams skated four aside. The Minutemen gained the win with three unanswered goals in the third.

The season-opening road woes continued for the Knights in Michigan as Wayne State overcame three Clarkson leads to hand the Green and Gold their third straight loss. Saturday's game started out well enough for the Knights as they took a 2-0 lead six minutes in on goals by **Mike Sullivan**, at 27 seconds, and a power-play marker by **Nathan Beausoleil**. The Warriors battled back to tie it with a pair of goals late in the first period. Clarkson went back on top on **Brodie Rutherglen's** goal at 15:31. WSU tied to start the second with a power-play goal at 7:46. **Nick Dodge** put the Knights back on top late in the second for a 4-3 lead through 40 minutes. Once again, however, the Warriors rallied back, scoring early in the third to tie and then netting the game-winner on a 3-on-1 break at 15:15. **Kyle McNulty** made 18 saves in his first action in the Clarkson goal since late January.

A third-period rally lifted Clarkson to its first win of the season. Trailing 3-2 entering the final frame, the Knights scored three unanswered goals to pull out the victory. **Mac Faulkner** started the comeback with his first goal of the season, a short-handed marker, at 1:03 on a wrap-around attempt. At 5:54, freshman defenseman **Grant Clitsome** put the Green and Gold on top on a shot from the blue line five seconds after a Clarkson power-play ended for his first collegiate goal. Faulkner sealed the win with an empty-net goal with 27 seconds remaining. Freshman **David Cayer**, with his first collegiate goal, and **John Sullivan** also scored. 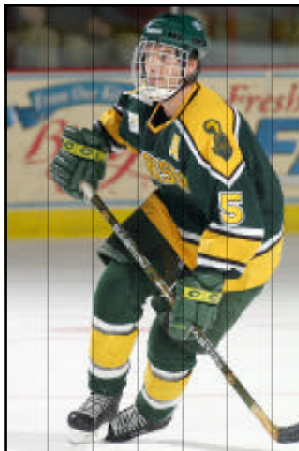

A sluggish effort on specialty teams play led to Clarkson's third straight loss to Rensselaer. In a penalty-filled contest, the Knights were 1-of-9 on the power play, while the Engineers tallied all five of their goals in 11 man-advantage attempts. The penalties came fast and furious right from the start with both teams scoring on the power play in the opening minute. RPI scored at 20 seconds followed by **Mac Faulkner's** team-high fifth goal of the season 28 seconds later. The Engineers scored their second goal with just five seconds left in a five-minute major penalty to the Knights at 14:27 and added two more scores in the second to make it 4-1 after 40 minutes. Clarkson rallied on a pair of goals 15 seconds apart by **Brodie Rutherglen** and **Jeff Genovy** midway through the third to close the gap to one, but RPI sealed the victory with an empty-net power-play marker with 22 seconds remaining.

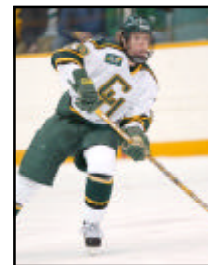

Clarkson fell behind 2-0 in the first period and could not recover as St. Lawrence held on for its fourth straight win over the Golden Knights in Canton. The Saints, who benefited from four power-play opportunities to start the game, dominated the opening 20 minutes out shooting the Green and Gold 16-4. Clarkson began to show some life in the middle frame and finally found the back of the net with 61 seconds left in the stanza on **Steve Zaleski's** third collegiate goal.
