
2006-07 SEASON in REVIEW

Twelve seniors who formed the cornerstone of the Clarkson University Women's Hockey team the past four seasons closed out their collegiate careers with an impressive resume and the knowledge in knowing that they established a solid foundation for an emerging program in the NCAA.

The Golden Knights' Class of 2007 skated to three winning campaigns in four seasons and helped the Green and Gold compile 69 total victories, a notable achievement for a neophyte program just getting off the ground.

With the seniors providing the leadership, a talent trio of freshmen sparking the offense, and a veteran tandem back stopped the Knights' stingy defensive effort, Clarkson proved once again that it was one of the most competitive teams in Division I in 2006-07.

Led by three-year captain Lindsay Williams and assistant captains Lauren Lubrano and Ashley Shadle, Clarkson was ranked among the top teams in the nation during a school-record eight-game, winning streak in the middle of the



season and finished with an 18-15-3 overall record, including 11 wins at Cheel Arena. Guided by head coach Rick Seeley and assistant Shannon Smith and Matt Desrosiers, the Knights tied for sixth in the ECACHL, regarded as the toughest league in women's hockey, with a 10-10-2 conference mark.

Clarkson's season came to a close in late February when the Knights pushed 5th-ranked St. Lawrence to the limit in the quarterfinal round of the league's playoffs in Canton, NY before falling 3-2 and 3-1 in the series.

Rookies Genevieve Lavoie, Britney Selina and Carlee Eusepi led the Knights' offense and provide a bright future for the Green and Gold. Lavoie, who scored a team-high 23 goals and 36 points, and Eusepi, who tallied 21 points from the blueline, were both named to the ECACHL All-Rookie team.

Senior Kira Hurley and Stephanie Hansen shared the duties in goals, with both posting three shutouts apiece, and helped the Knights rank among the top defensive squads in the country, allowing only 2.06 goals per game.

Clarkson wasted little time in starting off the new campaign with a bang as captain **Lindsay Williams** tallied the Knights' fastest goal ever just seven seconds in. Clarkson cruised from there adding five more goals in the first, two more in the second and its ninth goal late in the third. **Marie-Jo Gaudet** (2-3) and **Melissa Marshall** (2-2) powered the outburst with five and four points, respectively. Freshman **Britney Selina** scored one goal and one assist, while fellow rookie **Carlee Eusepi** also picked up her first career goal. **Christine Bailkowski** and **Jessica Cloutier** also scored. **Kira Hurley** was called upon to make just nine saves in recording her 18th career shutout.

Another solid defensive effort and some timely offense lifted Clarkson to weekend sweep off Vermont. Four different players scored for the Knights, while Clarkson allowed just nine shots on goal. Clarkson's fourth line, which was held off the score sheet in Friday's win, gave the Knights the early momentum when **Carolynn Zidek** scored her first goal in over two years, connecting at 4:31 of the first period. **Britney Selina** knocked in her second goal of the weekend at 16:22 of the second after a strong effort in the offensive zone by classmate **Genevieve Lavoie**. With 1:42 left in the middle frame, **Jessica Cloutier** converted on a rebound off a shot by senior **Melissa Marshall** to put the Green and Gold on top 3-0 after 40 minutes. Vermont finally got on the scoreboard for the first time during the weekend, at 14:41 of the third. Just 34 seconds later, however, **Marie-Jo Gaudet** put Clarkson back on top by three goals with her team-high third goal of the season. Marshall picked up her fourth assist of the weekend.

Three goals in the opening five minutes was enough for third-ranked Mercyhurst to hand Clarkson its first loss of the season. It took just 19 seconds for the Lakers to jump on the scoreboard, but the Knights' answered back at 2:28 with a power-play tally from **Katie Morrison**. The tie score lasted for just over a minute as Mercyhurst struck for a pair of goals just 22 seconds apart to go on top 3-1, 4:12 after the opening faceoff. **Britney Selina** scored with the man-advantage at 10:55 to make it a two-goal game after the first. The Lakers, however, added goals in the second and third periods to seal the win. Mercyhurst enjoyed a distinct advantage in shots, 41-14.
