2004-05 SEASON in REVIEW

By qualifying for the *Eastern College Athletic Conference Hockey League (ECACHL)* playoffs in its first year as a member of the 11-team league, *Clarkson University Women's Hockey* proved to be a program on the rise in the NCAA Division I ranks. Head coach **Rick Seeley** and assistant coaches **Shannon Smith** and **Laura Hays**, guided the youngest team in college hockey to a respectable showing in 2004-05 as the **Golden Knights** posted a 13-17-6 overall record in its second year as a varsity program, including an eighth-place 7-12-1 ECACHL mark. The **Green and Gold**, who lost seven one-goal games during the year, earned the final league postseason berth with a solid run down the stretch where they won four of their last seven league games. "This year was a great ex-

perience for us," stated Seeley. "We are very pleased with our progress. We had some nice wins." Clarkson swept league foes Cornell (2-0, 4-1), Union (2-1, 4-0) and Vermont (4-0, 3-0) and knocked off perennial ECACHL power Brown (3-2) along with tying North Country rival St. Lawrence (1-1). The Knights also swept Niagara (1-0, 4-3) and defeated Northeastern (2-1), Elmira (6-2), Quinnipiac (5-0) and Pittsburgh (3-1) in non-league play. Led by sophomore captain **Lindsay Williams** and assistant captains, senior **Kristi Shaw** and sophomore **Ashley Shadle**, the Knights made a big impression this winter and should begin to contend for the top spots in the ECACHL in the very near future.
